



Consider the text of Isaiah 53. This passage beautifully breaks down what Jesus endured out of love for the salvation of mankind. Jesus was socially alienated (v. 3), emotionally torn (v. 3), punished undeservingly (v. 5), rejected by those He loved (v. 6), and died without glory or honor (vs. 2, 9). This passage also describes Him as an offering (v. 10), justifying (v. 11) and bearing the sins of many (vs. 11,12), and making intercession for transgressors (v. 12). It is humbling when we pause and

meditate on the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus and what the gospel truly means. Notice how Paul describes the effect of the gospel in Romans 1:14-17. Paul felt indebted (v. 14). He expresses a feeling of responsibility to teach others about Jesus Christ. Paul felt a need to reach out to all nationalities (Greeks and Barbarians) and all schools of thought (wise and foolish). Yet, this indebtedness was not viewed as negative. Paul was eager and confident (v. 15) to fulfill his responsibility to preach the gospel of Christ (v. 16). Why? The gospel is the very source of salvation, revealing God's power and righteousness through faithful obedience. If we have been so richly blessed by God, it only makes sense that we would want to share that blessing with anyone and everyone. How do we respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ?
